

Four County Hires New Superintendent

Four County Career Center is pleased to announce the appointment of Tim Meister as superintendent of the school district beginning with the 2012-2013 school year. Following Thursday's Meeting of the Four County Career Center Board of Education, the board employed Mr. Meister effective August 1, 2012

Mr. Meister will replace William Spiess who will retire June 30th. Mr. Spiess has served the school district as superintendent for the past four years.

Tim Meister and his wife Karen are residents of Bryan. In 1989, he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Secondary English Education and K-12 Reading from The Defiance College. He received his Masters of Education degree along with his Principal's and Superintendent's Certification from Bowling Green State University.

Mr. Meister has a vast amount of administrative, teaching and coaching experience throughout his career. He taught Language Arts and was a basketball coach at Stryker Local School District from 1989 through 1992. From 1992 through 1995, Mr. Meister taught Language Arts and was a basketball coach at Worthington City Schools. In 1995, he then moved to the Bryan City School district where he taught Occupational Work Adjustment/Occupational Work Experience and was Athletic Director and head basketball and golf coach. Mr. Meister currently holds the position of Principal at Archbold Local Schools, a position he has held since 2006.

Throughout his career, Mr. Meister has also been active in educational and service associations and currently holds memberships in the Ohio Association of Secondary School Administrators; current president of Northwest Ohio District Athletic Board; and a member of the Archbold Rotary.

Mr. Meister looks forward to working with the Board of Education, staff, and students at the Career Center as well as Advisory Committee Members, staff from associate schools, members of the business community, and parents, to continue to strengthen the quality career and technical education programs currently in place. He plans to explore new educational opportunities for students to help prepare them for lifelong learning.
