Four County Career Center has implemented this laptop computer program where each student receives a laptop computer for their use during enrollment at the Career Center. There are only a few public schools in Ohio that offer this program and Four County is one of them.

The laptop is available for the students to take with them to class and home to do their homework. It also contains software that will provide a tutorial for the Ohio Graduation Tests.

Four County is a wireless zone where the students have controlled access to the internet for research. If students meet established guidelines in attendance and academics over the two years of enrollment, the laptop will be theirs to keep upon graduation. If students do not meet these guidelines, then they will have the option to purchase the computer at a minimal cost.
